School support assistant

It is possible that your child can attend school only with one school support assistant. In this case we are in a position to help you.

We employ our school support assistants, we have trained them and they are instructed and supported by our professionals. We organise the school support assistants in the field of mainstream as well as special needs schools.

The school support assistants meet the needs of your child. They support your child at school with different kinds of assistance. They will help, for example, in dressing and undressing your child, helping them to orientate themselves at school or with motivation and concentration. In the lessons they support your child, e.g. when reading and writing as well when working through tasks. They help in dealing with lesson materials and will also assume light nursing tasks.

The guiding principle is to support your child as much as necessary and as little as possible so that learnt independence is not forgotten and independence achieved can be further extended.

We will gladly advise you regarding questions on making applications and financing.

School social work at the school for sick children

The school social work is there for pupils, their parents and teachers at the school for sick children. It is important for us to maintain the educational opportunities and the school career during a stay in hospital.
